Opening Prayer: Blessed Lord, who caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning: Grant us so to hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that we may embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, which you have given us in our Savior Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.** "The Book of Common Prayer," Collect 28, page 236. Alternative prayer: Sixth Sunday of Easter, page 174 or 225.

Review of Last Week's Lesson: Last week's lesson emphasized that through our baptism with the Holy Spirit, God lives in us and we in him. In Acts 8, Philip met the Ethiopian on a road in the desert where he had the opportunity to help the Ethiopian understand the Scripture he was reading and to be baptized. The verses we read in Psalm 22 offered praise to the Lord. In I John 4, we were reminded to love one another. In John 15, Jesus declared that he is the "true vine." He used the illustration of the vine to explain that pruning does not have a negative effect on a vine. In fact, it causes a vine to bear more fruit. This illustration emphasized that when we abide in the Lord and he in us, we bear fruit.



Background Notes: Acts 10:44-48 Peter, with a group of Christians from Joppa, went to the home of Cornelius and preached the Gospel to Cornelius and everyone in his household. While he was there the Holy Spirit "fell upon all who heard the word."

He asks us to love one another. There are circumstances under which this can be very difficult, or even seem impossible. There may be people in your life who are very difficult for you to love. Ask God to help you find a way to change your attitude toward them.
